- **APD-** Agency for persons with disabilities
- **CA-** DCF Circuit Administrator who serves as CBCB's point of contact
- **CAPPAC-** Governor's advisory council for the prevention of child abuse and permanency planning
- **CAPTF-** Brevard County child abuse prevention task force
- **C.A.R.E.S.-** (Coordination, Advocacy, Resources, Education, Support)
Brevard C.A.R.E.S is Brevard Family Partnership's signature child abuse prevention program that provides care coordination and wraparound services for families to serve as a diversion program to prevent children from entering the child welfare system.
