

This year was amazing, for which I give much gratitude to the 300+ staff across the Family of Agencies, Brevard Family Partnership, Family Allies, and C.A.R.E.S. As a result of the salary increase in 2022 for our frontline staff, we have been able to see a steady increase in our employee retention. Our case managers and support staff are our most important asset. Without their hard work and dedication, we would not enjoy the success we are so proud of. They are now better compensated for that hard work and dedication.

Our governance board has continued to add community advocates to the board. What is refreshing about that is most of our new board members are younger professionals looking to make a difference. 
