POLICY:

Definitions: Restrictive behavior management interventions – isolation, manual restraint, mechanical restraint, chemical restraint, and locked seclusion. Family Partnerships of Central Florida Family of Agencies promotes and maintains a safe environment and provides the necessary support and resources to keep children, staff, caregivers, and families safe. Family Partnerships of Central Florida Family of Agencies uses a trauma informed, strength based and positive behavior approach to working with children in foster homes. As such, Family Partnerships of Central Florida provides training to foster parents, which uses this approach to ensure safety and quality care to the children served. At the initial PRIDE training for new foster parents, three hours of NAPPI training is provided. Family Partnerships of Central Florida utilizes the Non-Abusive Psychological and Physical Intervention (NAPPI) Training; a highly specialized approach to crisis prevention that focuses on verbal de-escalation to address challenging behavior. Select FPoCF Master's Level clinical management and leadership team members possess certifications in Train-the-Trainer and provide direct training.

According to the Florida Administrative Code 65C, only Community Residential Treatment Facilities are permitted to use restraint as a means of restricting the movement of a person's limbs, head, or body by the use of mechanical or physical devised for the purpose of preventing injury to self or others. Family Partnerships of Central Florida staff, subcontracted providers, and foster parents are not permitted to apply any restrictive behavioral management techniques as defined above.

Additionally, foster parents are required to sign and adhere to the Disciplinary Policy of The Department of Children and Families. Prohibited disciplinary practices include corporal

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punishment, verbal abuse, threats to remove children from the home or to physically punish, group punishment for an individual child's behavior, cruel or excessive punishment, placing a child in a locked room, delegating authority for punishment to other children or persons unknown to the child, and punishment for bedwetting or errors occurring during the toilet training process.
